Electrolysis	-can permanently remove hair follicles - involves passing an electrical current through a hair follicle, which damages the follicle and prevents new hair growth the only method of permanent hair removal available	-Permanent: Electrolysis is the only FDA-approved method of permanent hair removal. -Versatility: effective for people with any skin type, skin color, hair type, and hair color. Suitable for any area of the body — including the eyebrows. -No recovery time: People can resume their daily activities immediately after the procedure. -Maintenance-free: There is no need to schedule an annual electrolysis session — once the hair has been removed no more treatments are necessary. -No harsh chemicals: Unlike with laser hair removal or hair bleaching, electrolysis does not require the use of chemicals on the skin.	-Several sessions: If larger areas are being treated, it can take several long sessions to achieve permanent results. Also, removing coarse hair requires more sessions. Up to 30 treatments. -Discomfort: People undergoing electrolysis hair removal may experience some pain and discomfort.
